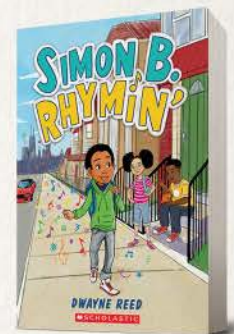


# THAT'S A RAP!

Make up your own rap just like Simon! You can rap about multiplication facts, anything you're learning about in school, your hobbies—it's all up to you!

- Think about the melody of a song you like, or make up your own. This will help you structure your rap's **rhythm**—a musical pattern.
- Brainstorm/bullet some nouns and action verbs that you'd like to include in your rap in the space below.



## TITLE

What is your rap called?

## HOOK

A short, catchy set of lyrics that grabs the attention of your audience and starts your rap.

## VERSE

A set of lyrics that expand on the hook. Verses sometimes rhyme and sometimes don't!

## CHORUS

A recurring set of lyrics. The chorus is often the most memorable part of the rap and drives home the rap's message!

## SECOND VERSE

Write a second verse in the space below—it can be the same or different as the first!

## CHORUS

Write your chorus again.

## OUTRO

Now, connect all of your lyrics and finish your rap! An outro is kind of like a hook, but it takes place at the end.
