  - How are Judy and Stink similar? How are they different?
  - What words would you use to describe Judy and Stink's relationship?
  - How does Judy and Stink's relationship affect other people?
  - If you were Stink, how would you react to Judy? If you were Judy, how would you react to Stink? Would you react the same as they do?
- 3. Share the printout classroom activity as a follow-up to your discussion.
